

Comparative and Superlative Predictions

Activity Type

Grammar Game: gap-fill, guessing, asking and answering questions from prompts (group and pair work)

Focus

Comparatives and superlatives

Aim

To practice forming, asking and answering questions with comparative and superlative adjectives.

Preparation

Make one copy of the worksheet for each pair of students and cut as indicated.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

In this comparatives and superlatives game, students complete questions with comparative or superlative adjectives and then predict a partner's answers to the questions.

Procedure

Divide the students into two groups (A and B).

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

First, students complete questions with the correct comparative or superlative form of the adjectives in brackets.

Afterwards, check the comparative and superlative adjectives and review the questions with each group.

Answer key

Student A

1. the best
2. more popular
3. the most interesting
4. busier
5. the most important
6. more useful
7. the friendliest
8. more active
9. the most difficult
10. healthier

Student B

1. the funniest
2. worse
3. the safest
4. shorter
5. the most beautiful
6. happier
7. the most expensive
8. harder
9. the most exciting
10. more fun

Next, each student pairs up with someone from the other group.

Tell the students not to show their worksheet to their partner.

Without talking, students predict their partner's answers to the questions and write them down in the second column.

Students then take turns asking and answering the questions and comparing their partner's answers with the predictions.

For each correct prediction, students score a point.

The student with the most points at the end of the game wins.

Finally, students tell the class what they found out about their partner.

Any interesting findings can then be discussed in more detail.

Comparative and Superlative Predictions
